

NEW ENGINE GOAL

Bemus Point is noted for taking excellent care of their equipment. We provide most of the maintenance ourselves. Some of our people have attended manufacturer schools just so we can do as much as possible and not pay for it; however, eventual replacement of a piece of apparatus is inevitable. This is the situation with our 1968 Maxim/ Ford Fire Engine. We must replace it within the next two years. We have been budgeting and saving. Most of our fund raising efforts, such as this one, will be devoted to paying for a pumper/ tanker that will probably cost in the neighborhood of \$80,000. BEMUS POINT F.D. 10-K LAKE RUN

In 1983 the fire department took on a sporting event which has grown by leaps and bounds. The Bemus Point Fire Department 10-K Lake Run has become the largest and most popular race in Western New York and Northwestern Pennsylvania. It has drawn 232 runners in 1983, increased to 303 runners in 1984, and last year drew 406 runners, representing 13 different states including 1 from Canada and 1 from as far as Esther, Alaska.

The money we make on the race goes directly to equipment. In 1983 we made \$521.00 that went to buy tune-out gear such as helmets, gloves, coats, bunker pants, etc. In 1984 we made \$492.00; this was used for purchasing a heart monitor. Last year we made \$927.00; this was used for a new Johnson outboard engine for the rescue boat.

This year, we predict approximately 500 runners. The event will take place Sunday, June 29, 1986, and will start at 9:00 at the village park.

PARKING PROBLEMS

Many people do not realize that the Bemus Point Fire District does not have any fire hydrants. There are two basic ways we fight fire. One way is with the water we have on our two engines (1,000 gallons E-441, 850 gallons E-442), and that of our mutual aid units called in from neighboring departments. The other way is to obtain water by laying a hose line to a water source such as the lake, pond, creek, swimming pool, etc.

Howver, if access fire lanes and roadways are blocked or made too narrow, we can't get to the water. This is an ever increasing problem that we are facing. Our population and activity in the area is increasing from season to season, and so does the parking problem. We ask your support and help in being considerate of where you park, and to help make others considerate of where they park. It would be very sad to see a life or property lost because of a carelessly parked vehicle or thoughtlessly piled dock.

LAS VEGAS IN BEMUS POINT "CASINO NIGHTS"

A few years ago, New York State legalized games of chance for non-profit organizations. The Bemus Point Fire Department was the first in the state to start this activity. During the summer months, we offer black jack, money wheel, craps, and bang table. We always have a good crowd and they have a lot of fun!

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS INCIDENTS

The responsibilty of the modern fire placed upon the department is constantly increasing. One of those areas is hazardous materials incidents. The Bemus Point Fire Department was faced with two incidents of this type this past summer. Ironically, both happened in almost the very same location. Both times, fuel oil had spilled from a truck tanker. In coordination with the contractor, the Chautauqua County Hazardous Materials team and the Bemus Point Fire Department the situation was quickly neutralized. The spill was contained by building small dikes. The fuel was then absorbed with specialized absorbent granules and pads. Runoff into buildings and the lake was prevented.

"SNOW" SOFTBALL

For the third consecutive year, Bemus Point Firefighters fielded a team at the "Snow Softball" tournament in Sinclairville. The tournament is a fund raiser to help firefighters and/or their families in times of need.

For anyone not familiar with the tournament, all players have to be volunteer firefighters, and must wear their fire gear while playing. After playing four games, everyone was pretty worn out but it was well worth the effort.

Also, taking home a first place trophy helped alleviate the fatigue!

THE STORK STRIKES

On a cold, close to blizzard condition night, we received an alarm of a woman in labor at Gene Ross residence on Westman Road. Upon arrival, the rescue personnel found Mrs. Cathy Shephard (First Assistant Chief Jim Shephard's wife) who is a neighbor and registered nurse, aiding Gene's daughter. The rescue squad delivered a baby girl and administered IV's, along with other treatment, to the mother and baby. They then transported both to W.C.A. Hospital through a very wintery night. We now have one stork sticker on the rescue unit.

RESCUE BOAT

Three years ago the contractor for the Chautauqua Lake Bridge, donated their aluminum work boat and engine to us. The boat had received hard use but through the efforts of Captain Bruce Johnson, the boat has been completely restored and modified for water rescue use. We purchased a trailer, which was obtained through Dick Sparling of Shore Acres Boat Yard, at a very reasonable price. With our Casino Night and 10-K Race money, we bought a motor from L-S Aero Marine, which was also very reasonably priced.

The intent is to have as fast a response as possible regardless of the time of year. During the summer months, it is on a lift in front of Bob Stahley's on Lakeside Drive. It is equally important, if not more, to have the boat available in the off season when others aren't around. At that time, it is on the trailer in front of the fire station. Either way, our response is extremely fast. We have averaged an enroute time within two minutes of dispatch for all three times we have been called recently.
