ICE RESCUE DRILL

By: Dan Burns, Public Information Officer, Bemus Pt. F.D. February 8, 1998, the Bemus Point Volunteer Fire Department sponsored an Ice Rescue Drill on Chautauqua Lake near the Bemus Point Ferry landing of the Bemus Stow Ferry.

This drill included Bemus Point, Ashville, Chautauqua, Dewittville, Maple Springs, Fluvanna, and Gerry Fire Departments, along with the Chautauqua County Water Emergency Team. Approximately 45 people took part in this drill, which included ice rescue, extrication from the water, and also allowed for orientation and practice with several different pieces of ice rescue

The Bemus Point air boat, the Dewittville Hover Craft, and the "Arrive Alive" Ice rescue sleds



from the Chautauqua Fire Department, Maple Springs Fire Department, and the Chautauqua County Water Emergency Team were used in the drill.

In completing this training, it was no surprise that very unstable ice was encountered due to this year's warmer than normal winter.

BOSTON WHALER

Our Fire Department now has in service a new Rescue Boat which is a Boston Whaler. The boat is a 22 ft. Guardian with a 1998 225HP Mercury Outboard engine.

The new boat is the most "State of the Art" Rescue Boat available today. We are very fortunate to have

this piece of equipment.



The Port (left) side has a 34" cutout for the ease of sliding in a back boarded patient at water level instead of over the gunwale.

The boat is docked off Lakeside Dr., under the watchful eye of the Stahley family, on a new lift with a canopy top. The dock has 10 new dock horses and dock sections.

E.M.T.'s

In 1997, 85% of the Bemus Pt. Fire Department's calls were for Medical Emergencies.
Our 1st responders have 30 hours of Medical Training. The Basic EMT's have had 110 hours of training, including hands on hospital and Automatic Heart Defribulation training.
Our Advanced Emergency Technicians or a EMT, CC's have gone through 310 hours of training including ER and Ambulance time with WCA. They have the ability to offer more Advanced Care, such as Medication administration, ability to start IV's and Manual Heart Defribulation.
