WHALE PROGRAM TO BEGIN

The Bemus Point Volunteer Fire Department is beginning a program called WHALE, an acronym for We Have A Little Emergency. The goal of this program is to ensure the proper and efficient rescue and treatment of children riding in car safety seats who are involved in motor vehicle accidents. For children participating in this program, an informational label is attached to the back of the car safety seat that the child occupies. The label contains important information about that child. WHALE logo

stickers are then attached to the car safety seat and to the rear windows of the vehicle in order to alert

rescuers that the vehicle occupants participate in the program. If the car seat is no longer used, sold, given away, or even temporarily used for another child, the

information label as well as the WHALE logo stickers should all be removed. If your family is interested in participating in the WHALE program, please contact any Bemus Point Volunteer Fire Department Chief.

BEMUS POINT CHIEF ALERTS RESIDENTS TO POSSIBILITY OF AMBULANCE FEES

The possibility that area residents will be charged for ambulance service under some circumstances has been noted by Ted Farnham, chief of the Bemus Point Volunteer Fire Department. Farnham explained that the Bemus Point department, like most area voumteer fire departments, is experiencing a shortage of members, and that in some instances it may be necessary to call for assistance from the WČA Hospital based ambulance service. In those cases, residents can expect to receive a bill, Farnham said.


"Unfortunately, there are times when our EMTs are out of the area, or otherwise unable to respond. Also, there are times when we encounter a critical situation where our EMTs feel that they need additional help. At those times we will have no choice but to call WCA for assistance," Farnham stated.

"While we certainly wish that we did not have the necessity for this action, we are sure that area residents would agree that it is in the best interest of all concerned in a life or death situation,"Farnham said. The chief went on to note that the fire department ambulance service is supported mainly through fund raising efforts and donation, with a portion of its revenues coming from tax monies. "We have never made a charge for our services, and never will, as long as we remain a volunteer organization. While we sincerely appreciate the generous support that our community has given us, the best way for residents of our fire district to ensure that this service is available when needed is to become active themselves. Anyone over the age of 16 is eligible for membership in the department," the chief said.
