FIRE FIGHTER of the YEAR Andrew Brodell

Bemus Point Volunteer Fire Department has been fortunate in recruiting young, motivated members who are flourishing with classes, training, and the opportunity to utilize those skills and this year's Fire Fighter of the Year is one of the driving forces in that movement: Andrew Brodell.

Andy was born in Warren, Ohio but considers Bemus his home town since he and his family have always spent a great deal of time here whenever possible around their busy schedules. His father, James, who has an Orthopedic Practice and his mother, Ann, who manages the office, instilled a progressive work ethic in their boys, Jim and Andy. Persistent lessons in proper speaking and writing as well as encouraging the pursuit of career-oriented training and education prepared the boys for leadership positions but also reminds them to never stop learning. Andy has put these lessons to good use as he has been extremely active with introducing opportunities for procuring new tools and equipment by presenting all of the information needed in clear, concise language. Once the new tools and equipment have been acquired, he works with the members to find the best solutions for mounting them into the apparatus, and then training the Responders on proper use and maintenance.

At 23 years of age and five years of very active membership, Andy was elected to 3rd Assistant Chief, a role he has fulfilled with respectful confidence. He had originally joined the Hamilton Fire Department in Madison County where he was going to school, but signed on to Bemus Point as a permanent resident after a short time. From that start at Hamilton he brought with him innovative ideas to update and improve our department which has re-energized not only the new recruits, but also long-time members. According to Andy "the best firefighters pursue a career of training. Those who discontinue their involvement fall behind while the service progresses," which is why he was appointed as the Training Officer, and train he does. On most any non-meeting Tuesday night you will find Andy at the center of whatever training is going on, whether it is practicing with tools, learning new skills, or educating on new fire/rescue techniques. "Leaders should be on the ground with their crews, both in the classroom and on the fireground," he believes is the best practice to ensure that everyone is on the same page and keeping up with the latest techniques and procedures.



20 New Airpacks & More

This year, BPVFD finished our most recent large scale project by putting 20 new self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA's) on our trucks, along with 2 rapid-intervention-team (RIT) packs, and a 5,000 PSI filling unit in our station. Our new airpacks boast longer operating time in smaller bottles, larger field of view, safer and more integrated electronics, and thermal imaging capabilities on every firefighter. We are grateful for the opportunity to make the project happen with the help of Travis Rawleigh at Churchville Fire Equipment and most importantly, the members of our community who continuously donate to our department. We thank you!

Student Safety and Prevention

We know it's one thing to lecture to students about fire safety and quite another to involve them in the lesson which is why we invite the Bemus Point Elementary students into the Fire Station to teach them about fire safety. There is nothing quite like seeing and touching those huge Fire Trucks and all the equipment that goes with them. Once you have their attention, now you can teach them about



keeping themselves and their families safe through Prevention and Escape Plans. Backpacks with coloring books, stickers, heat-sensitive rulers, and Junior Firefighter Helmets are given to the students as reminders of their trip to the station, but more importantly each item reinforces the lessons taught in the classroom and demonstrated by the Firefighters. So, when your child comes home and wants to know where all the Smoke Alarms are located and if the batteries have been changed, and then wants to create an Escape Plan, know they are learning how to keep your family safe during a fire. And when they ask about how safe those candles are, or if your Christmas Tree is adequately watered, you'll know they are learning to keep your family safe by preventing a fire.
